Since 2014, the country has recorded previously unknown growth rates in gross domestic product (GDP) of more than six percent. This makes it one of the fastest growing economies in Africa. For 2021 the Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU) is forecasting GDP growth of 6.8 percent. For 2022 and 2023, in view of the oil production that will then begin, rates of around ten percent are predicted. The prospect of a boom currently spreads a high level of optimism on the ground.
